




12-Month Outcome Report ...a look at the recovery journey

At Homewood Research Institute (HRI) we continue to explore outcomes of patients who receive treatment in Addiction Medicine Services (AMS) at Homewood Health Centre. Our recovery monitoring system allows us to explore data from patients who have agreed to complete questionnaires at the time of admission, discharge, and at 1, 3, 6 and 12 months post-discharge. The following report looks at 113 participants who were admitted and discharged between April 2015 and March 2016, and completed the survey at the admission and 12-month time points.




What characteristics are associated with abstinence?

Who did we speak to?






Overall fewer participants reported problems with their attendance at work/school or being disciplined on the job/at school
